

Elder Highlight: Liz Logan



Liz Logan is a Dene woman from the Fort Nelson First Nation. Liz is a descendent of Chief Jimmie Badine who signed the Fort Nelson First Nation adhesion to Treaty #8. She is the former Chief of the Fort Nelson First Nation and served for six terms. Liz's hard work on behalf of her people was recognized by the 2006 Aboriginal Woman of the Year Aurora Award of Distinction and 2011 Most Dedicated Aboriginal Lead Award. She was involved in many committees and served on many boards like the BCAFN Board of Directors, New Relationship Trust, as well as the Indian Resource Council/Indian Oil and Gas Canada. Liz enjoys sharing knowledge, especially with high schools, on cultural protocols for ribbon shirts and skirts, oral storytelling, history of residential schools, and sewing.
