New Dakelh Language Puppet Show!



The Camp Bologna (Camp Fire & Shelter Building Puppet Show) is an interactive puppet show which will teach students the traditional way of building a bush shelter through conversations. Students will use target language such as "What is it? - Di hont'oh?", "What is he saying? - Daja ni?", "Why?-Dika?" and "Yes - A, No - 'Andooh". Students will also learn about Drumming Protocol from Elder Clifford and learn how to count numbers 1 - 10 in Dakelh through a song and drumming.
